## Financial Report

The Finance Committee met last Monday night and heard a good report from our Treasurer, Mr. Bill Barclay. Through the first five months of the year, we have had an income of \$175,300.09, with expenses of \$168,431.49, giving a positive cash flow of \$6,868.69 of income over expenses, which is a good thing to have going into the summer months when expenses normally exceed income. Our

income is running \$11,383.86 below the pro rata budget, and expenses are running \$14,143.72 below the pro rata budget. Our loan balance is \$223,418.16, and we are making payments of \$2,500 a month.

Thank you for your support! Let’s keep up the good work and keep our church financially strong through the summer months.

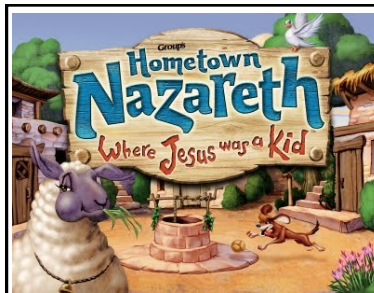

## UMCOR Flood Buckets

Bishop Janice Huie has asked that we help UMCOR Sager Brown Depot get together flood buckets for relief in the Mississippi River basin. It is possible for individuals or groups to put together flood buckets themselves according to some fairly rigid guidelines, but a far simpler way is just to donate money. ## McDonough Hall Renovation

The McDonough Hall Renovation Committee made up of Dr. Dan Darby, Traci Turner, Lynn Hardy, Joanna Watters, Christine Gill, Ryan Harkey, Lee Wise, and Dustin Meaders met with representatives from The LaBiche Architectural Group consisting of Dohn LaBiche, FAIA, Greg Wall, AIA, and Coley Mulcahy on Monday, May 25, for their first consultation. The primary purpose of the meeting was to establish priorities for the renovation of the classroom area of the building. The building was built in 1964, and named for Mr. and Mrs. A.T. McDonough, who were faithful and generous members. The renovation of the fellowship hall and kitchen areas were completed two years ago, and after almost fifty years of service, the classroom area of the building needs extensive remodeling.

The committee did an excellent job of communicating with the architects the needs of the church. Concerns addressed include (not in any particular order):

1. Fire Marshal Safety Code issues. A new fire alarm and emergency lighting systems are to be installed this summer at a cost of \$15,085 for the fire alarm and \$3066 for the lighting.
2. Asbestos Remediation – there is an issue that the flooring tile in the classrooms contains asbestos. An asbestos survey has been completed and will be forwarded on to Dohn LaBiche. New flooring is needed in the classrooms.
3. Maintenance concerns – longevity/durability of materials, fixtures, finishes, etc. The newly renovated building will need to have a very low maintenance needs and costs.
4. McDonough Hall is a very publicly viewed space, the interior of the building needs to reflect the quality of the education.
5. Hallway renovations ideas include new bulletin board locations, wall finishes (high/low cork strips, self-healing wall covering), and different colored hallways.
6. Currently, the required ratio of toilets to children (1 per 17) must include the public restrooms in the hallway. These restrooms are rarely ever used by the children because of supervision requirements. Additional toilets would be preferred in the existing toilet rooms adjacent to each classroom. This may be accomplished by using fixtures more suitable for children. Additionally, the public restrooms need to be brought up to current ADA standards.
7. The finishes/fixtures for all restrooms need to be replaced.
8. An additional restroom for the Music Room (#304) would be preferred. Possible locations include expanding the room into either the hallway in front of the Boy Scout Meeting Room or the exterior of the building on the other side of the exterior door. Either way, the exterior exit door

would have to be removed and the exit between rooms 304 and 305 would have to be closed. Further research will be needed to see if the exit door can be removed. Extra space in this area could be used for a storage closet for the music room.

9. Exterior doors need to be replaced; the new ADA compliant entry doors should have push button self-opening ADA hardware. Also, the interior doors need to be replaced and the hardware updated to comply with ADA standards.

10. Sound transfer thru the doors is an issue at certain times. One suggestion is to replace the door transfer grilles with ceiling transfer grilles.

11. The building needs a “Timeless” color scheme with tan/earth tones, blues and greens. All colors should be neutral and attractive to young children.


12. The ceiling, ceiling grid and light fixtures need to be replaced throughout the building.

13. Classrooms need more storage space. Smarter/built-in storage is needed for seasonal decorations, arts and crafts supplies, nap mats, etc.

14. No carpet shall be installed in any of the classrooms because of cleanliness issues with children. Carpet squares and area carpets would be acceptable as long as they are easily moveable and have a dedicated storage space.

15. Existing windows should be replaced; all are drafty and cold in the winter months. The wood trim around some of the windows may be rotten. Window treatments should not have any type of choking hazard for children, pleated shades are one possibility.

16. The committee voted to follow a more traditional theme as opposed to a contemporary theme with the renovation.

	<p>Twenty four of our children and youth have signed up for camp, along with four adults going as counselors. Camp Registrar, Rev. Greg Edwards reports that the camp is short five male counselors.
