Dan's Divinities

We will begin Confirmation Classes on Wednesday, September 28. Class will be held in Cravens Hall, room 204, from 4:00 p.m. until 5:30 p.m. every Wednesday that school is in session until we finish the curriculum, which like will be for the entire school year since we have 36 hours of training to accomplish. Refreshments will be in McDonough Hall prior to 4:00 p.m. Any youth who is in sixth grade, seventh grade, or above is eligible to attend, especially if they have not attended confirmation classes previously.

Confirmation classes help the youth understand the basics of the Christian faith, and help them to take the next step of their Christian discipleship through preparing them to take their vows of Baptism and/or Confirmation, and join the church. We will teach them about our denomination and acquaint them with church history, government, and doctrine. We will strive to help lead them to make the decision to be lifelong disciples of Jesus.

We will be studying the new *Credo* curriculum put out by Cokesbury and

the United Methodist Publishing House. One new aspect of the program is mentoring. We will be looking for adult mentors for each of the youth who will help guide them through the confirmation process and be another adult in the church to whom they can relate. We believe that this could be a life changing experience both for our youth and the mentors.

To introduce you, your child, and our mentors to the program, we will have a Confirmation Orientation meeting on Sunday evening, October 2, from 6:00 until 7:00 p.m. in Cravens Hall, room 200.

We will try to provide transportation to the church from the school for those youth who need it.

Last year we chose a new format for our Fall Luncheon with a morning session and an afternoon session and this year we have two speakers, Jeanette Clift George and Rev. Michelle Hall.



Jeannette Clift George is the founder and Artistic Director of the A.D. Players, the Houston-based Christian Theater Company which offers plays throughout the world. Jeanette's film debut was in *THE HIDING PLACE*, portraying Corrie ten Boom, a Dutch woman who saved the lives of Jews during the Nazi occupation. Jeanette is equally well known as an author, playwright, Bible teacher and national speaker. In her radio program, *Jeanette Clift George from Center Stage*, her unique wit and keen

insights illuminate Biblical principles. She is author of several books and is currently working on two more books.

Our afternoon session will be with **Rev. Michelle Hall**. She is currently serving as chaplain for Wiley College. Prior to coming to Wiley in August of 2008 she served for 4 ½ years as an associate pastor at First United Methodist Church in Houston, Texas. She is passionate about sharing the love of Christ and His empowering, transformative and redemptive love.

Reverend Hall accepted the call to ministry during her tenure as an administrator at the Texas Medical Center and while serving dual roles as chaplain for the Harris County Hospital District and The Methodist Hospital. She is an ordained elder in The Texas Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church.

She volunteers at Good Shepherd Hospital, Marshall, Texas. Reverend Hall enjoys preaching and speaking throughout Texas. She is certified as a pastoral care specialist. She is married to Hollis Hall and they celebrated twenty-five years on July 26, 2010, and they are the proud parents of "an incredible person and a great son, Garrett Hall" who is a senior at Texas State University.

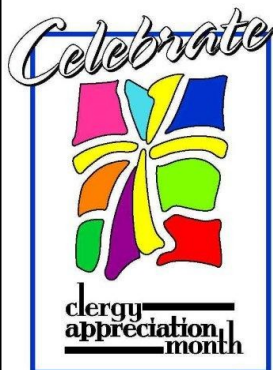
