I would like to ask you for a special 40 day period of prayer, and, if the Lord so leads you, of fasting. We have four critically important things coming up in the life of our church during the next month and a half. I would like you to intensely pray during this time for the following:

- **Youth Sunday.** For Laity Sunday this year, I have asked our youth to lead both services on October 10. Mike McMullen will be preaching. Mike and his wife, Judy, are our Youth Directors, and the youth have just fallen in love with them and our youth ministry is growing. The new youth praise band, *Spoken By Faith*, will lead worship in both services.

- **Church Conference.** Our District Superintendent, Dr. Richard (Dick) White, views our Church Conference as a Strategic Planning event for the church. We will assess the needs of our mission field and how we can best be in ministry to meet those needs. We will assess the **SWOT** – the **S**trengths and **W**eaknesses of our church, and **O**pportunities for ministry we have and **T**hreats we may experience. The Church Conference will

be on Sunday, October 17, at 7:00 p.m., and will be preceded by a “Stack” Supper at 6:00 that will be prepared for you. If I understand the meal, the recipe for a Stack Supper has to do with stacking various foods on top of each other. All the members and constituents of the church are invited, although only church members have voting privileges. We need to pray that the Lord will help us shape and clarify our ministry through this meeting. What do you see as the mission field around the church? What are the needs? What can we do to be in ministry to these needs?

- **Revival.** Our fall revival will be Sunday through Wednesday, October 24-27, 7:00 p.m. nightly. The Rev. Jason Burnham will be preaching and Rev. DeAndre Johnson will be leading worship from our new piano in the sanctuary. These two young men are extremely talented and dedicated. Pray that the Lord will use you and each of us to invite people to come. In fact, ask the Lord to give you five to ten people to begin praying for, and then invite them to come. I’ll tell you more about Jason and DeAndre elsewhere in this newsletter.

- **Stewardship Campaign.** Our church has struggled financially this year. The future of ministry will depend, in part, on a good response to our stewardship campaign. Beginning in late October, we will begin to talk about why we should give, about what is in our church budget and program and why it is worthy of support, our connectional work with other churches, and how the Lord has called each of us to be in Christian ministry. Each person will have the opportunity to make a pledge of their time, talents, gifts, and service to Christ and his Church. A special guest will be with us on November 7, All Saints Sunday. Rev. B.T. Williamson, the Assistant to the Bishop of the Texas Annual Conference will be here to talk about our connections to the saints and to other Methodist churches in giving and mission.

So, each of you are asked to be a prayer warrior for these essential events which are occurring in the life of our church during the next month and half.

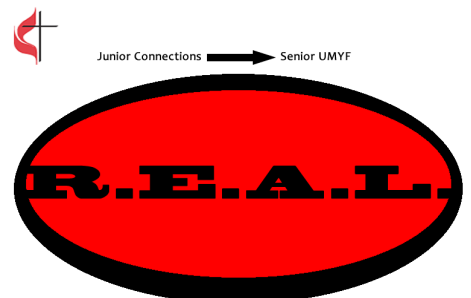
## Youth Sunday!

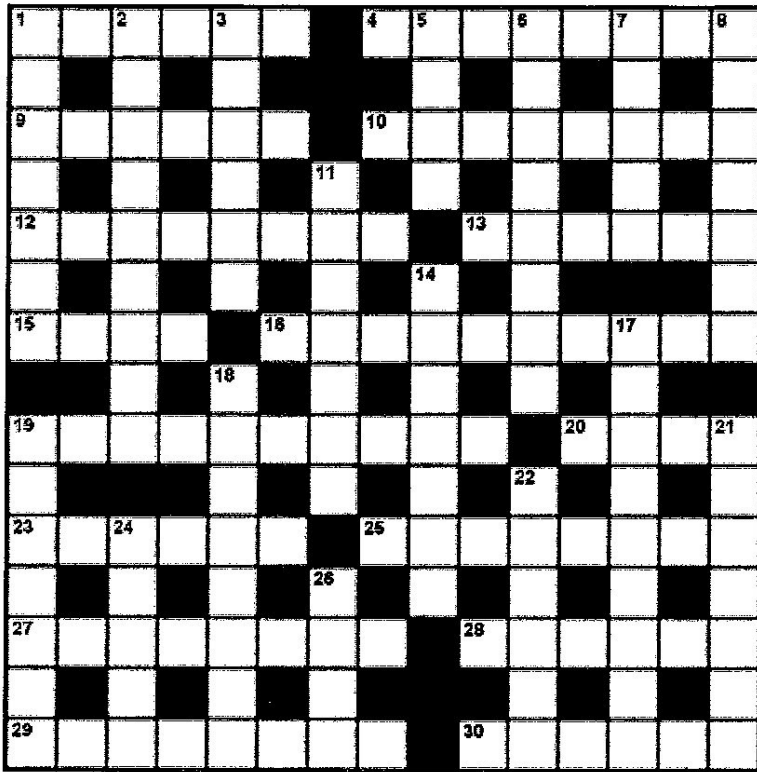
